CHAPTER I

INTRODUCTION

In this chapter, the researcher focuses on several aspects: (1) Background of the Study, (2) Research Questions, (3) Objective of the Study, (4) Theoretical Framework, (5) Scope and Limitation of the Study, (6) Significance of the Study, (7) Definition of Key Terms, and (8) Organization of the Study.

1.1 Background of the Study

Learning is a process; the learning process of young learners is a very crucial state. It creates a standard and foundation for young learners to learn in their upcoming years as they grow up. As young learners have their own complex way of thinking, teachers are expected to be creative during the teaching-learning process. However, young learners have the tendency to feel intimidated when speaking to adults. Through this, teachers are expected to have teaching media tools that will help them to get closer with their students. Therefore, teachers have the urgency to develop more creative teaching media to adapt with the young learners today and will attract young learners.

Puppet is one of teaching media that teachers can use in the teaching process. It attracts the curiosity of young learners because puppets have different figures. improving students' speaking skill. Through this research the researcher would like to know the experiences of teachers in using puppets as their teaching media. The method used is narrative inquiry. The researcher also would like to know the past experiences teachers have gone through. Each teacher will have their own story, their difficulties, their own uniqueness in using the puppets. This will be discovered and analyzed in this research.

1.2 Research Questions

1.3 Research Objectives

1.4 Theoretical Framework

1.6 Scope and Limitation of the Study

I will have two Playgroup teachers in Surabaya to be interviewed and they will talk about their experience and struggle in using puppets. The puppets used are limited to Doll Puppets and Paper or Handmade Puppets.

1.7 Definition of Key Terms Puppets

According to merriam-webster.com (Merriam Webster, n.d.) it defines puppet as a small-scale figure (as of a person or animal) usually with a cloth body and hollow head that fits over and is moved by the hand. Puppets in this research are two-dimensional or three-dimensional figures that is used as a medium for young learners to learn.

Teaching media

Teaching media are used to explain language meaning and construction, engage students in a topic, or as the basis of a whole activity (Harmer, 2001, p.134). Media is means of expressing message and information. In this research, teaching media is defined as puppets which are used by teachers to help students engaged in the learning activities.

Young learners

Linse (as cited in Sriwahyuni, 2019) defined young learners as children between the ages of 5 to 12 years old. Here it can be concluded that, young

learners are children who are studying in Kindergarten to Elementary School. Young learners in this study refers to students aged 18 months to 5 years old who are at toddler up to kindergarten.

Perspective

According to merriam-webster.com, perspective as a noun means the interrelation in which a subject or its parts are mentally viewed. In this study, perspective refers to the point of view of the teachers on the use of puppets as a teaching media in the classroom.
