How're you?

I'm sorry for not getting back to you sooner. We've gone through your revised paper and found it very interesting and useful for our prospective readers.

I'm pleased to inform you that your paper is accepted for publication in PASAA in Vol. 48 (July - December 2014). However, we would like you to further make a few amendments on the manuscript.

In the last paragraph of Section 1 (Introduction), you refer to yourself as `...an attempt of the writer to share classroom practice...". However, in Section 4 (for example, in Paragraph 2), you refer to yourself as `...I implemented not only...". To make it consistent, perhaps you may consider using either `I' throughout the manuscript (to make it more conversation-like when sharing teaching tips with others) or `the writer'. This depends on you (but personally, I'd go for `I' here.).

Also in Paragraph 2 (Sec 4), you mention that the paper is based on your classroom teaching experience in "...semester of 2008/2009 academic". As the manuscript will be published in 2014, some may wonder why the sharing of the idea is delayed (in a sense, it seems what you share is a bit old when we consider the year of the practice/experience). I guess that you have found the teaching activities you used in 2008/2009 useful and you have used them in your class until now. Perhaps, you may add a few sentences somewhere in the paper to show readers that although what you are sharing in this paper is based on
