

# **CHAPTER V**

## **CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTIONS**

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This chapter provides the conclusion of the study discussed in section 5.1, and also the suggestion discussed in section 5.2, which are composed by the researcher for future writers who want to conduct the similar study.

#### 5.1 Conclusion

The researcher used Linda and Eyre (1997) theory for analyzing the value. Linda and Eyre (1997) categorized moral values in ten types which are honesty, bravery/courage, peace ability, self-reliance/confident and potential, self-discipline and moderation, loyalty, respect, love, kindness and friendliness, and also Justice and mercy. Moreover, the researcher only used one of the best moral values (self-reliance) which is often appear in the movie Furthermore, the researcher also used Ralph Waldo Emerson (1841) essay for analyzing the value. He wrote in his essay about self-reliance which is as part of his first volume of collected essay.

From this study which has been conducted, the researcher found the self-reliance that is represented in the movie. Self-reliance has a powerful value. People who have it, they will help other people by receiving responsibility and doing their best in the world. And for people who do not have it, they will hurt other people by accusing them and by failing in order to develop the gifts and talents that can serve or enlighten or even benefit other people. Based on the script of the movie, self-

reliance about the importance of convincing or encouraging people own thoughts and intuitions, rather than clinging to public norms.

Self-reliance is very important in our life. Having self-reliance means people are able to solve their problems and make decisions by themselves. This is important for them when they grow older to live independently that allow them to feel happy by themselves, in themselves and about themselves without needing to rely on others. Besides that, the researcher also found that through the script of the movie, self-reliance is developing self-acceptance, which involves acquiring self-knowledge and practicing self-compassion.

## **5.2 Suggestions**

Having finished with the study, the researcher would like to propose some suggestions for the future writers or researchers in order to conduct a better study.

Firstly, this study only focused on the dialogue or to be specific some phrases in a dialogue of the movie which reflected the use of values based on Linda and Eyre and Ralph Waldo Emerson theory, omitting other important elements like gestures, expressions, songs or audio, costumes, and other important elements in a movie. The researcher realized that it is insufficient for relying only on the dialogue; it is suggested to use other elements in future studies using a very good,

comprehensive, and relatable book of Linda and Eyre and Ralph Waldo Emerson about moral values.

Secondly, the researcher realizes that this study is not perfect. Therefore, it is important to notice the weakness of this study. Since this is a qualitative study, the most difficult challenge is to avoid subjectivity. The technique of “*Investigator Triangulation*” that has been done in this study is indeed helpful to decrease the subjectivity; however, the researcher did not consider to ask an expert to help her observe the data. Therefore, it is important for the future researcher to ask for a help from an expert or lecturer of this field of study, so that the validity or trustworthiness of the study can be increased for these two elements are essential for a qualitative study.

Lastly, the writer wanted to suggest that those who are also interested in literary analysis can use other literary works such as novel, songs, etc. It would be much more interesting and deeper in analysis if future researchers use novels or songs as the data source.

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
